

FAA Flight Physicals

Aeromedical Exams are a necessary part of your aviation requirements.

You must hold a valid and current pilot medical certificate to pilot any powered aircraft except when exercising sport pilot privileges.

All pilots, from the general aviation student pilot to the EAA enthusiast and the airline pilot, are required to get regular flight physicals. The goal of the flight physical is two fold. First, to ensure that the pilot is healthy and physically able to safely pilot an aircraft without being a danger to him or herself or to his or her passengers. The second is to assure the public that the individual behind the yoke is fit to be there.
